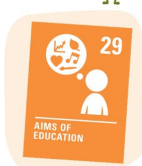
Mutual Respect and Tolerance

Things to talk about at home ...

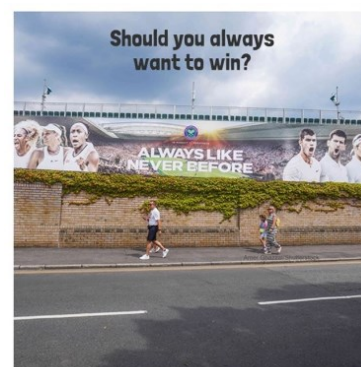
- Ask adults at home what they know about the Wimbledon tennis tournament. Have you watched any of it together this year?
