Fingerprint Spring Wreath

Supplies

- A wreath cut out of green card from this template
- Ribbon- green or yellow
- Hole punch
- Paints in shallow pots
- Felt tip pens







Have the wreath and a selection of paints in shallow pots ready to use.



Create a chick by printing a yellow thumbprint, followed by a yellow fingerprint on the top for the head.



Create finger print animals and scenes on the wreath, again using thumb and finger prints.



Once completed, leave the paint to dry. Once dry, use felt pens to add detail such as faces, feathers, grass etc.



Finally, cut a length of ribbon and loop through the wreath, tying or sticking together at the top with tape.




Fingerprint Spring Wreath



Supplies

Step 1. Have the wreath and a selection of paints in shallow pots ready to use.
