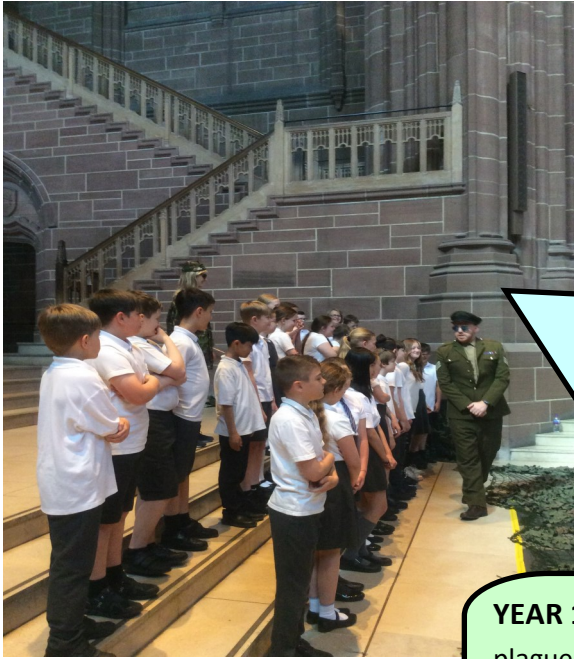

"Warm and Welcome Chat" Next dates: Thursday 25th May, Thursday 8th June, Thursday 22nd June

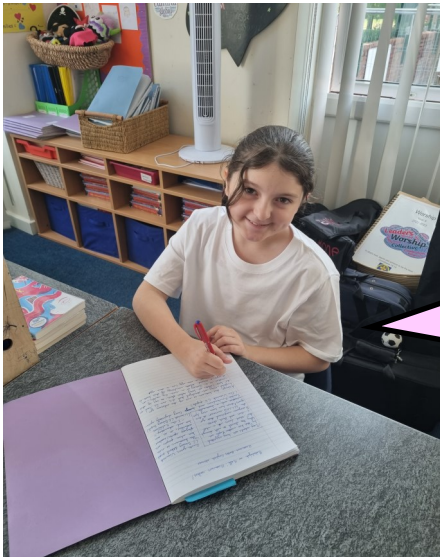
In the church hall from 10.00am to 12pm.
