PHONICS

This half term we will be covering the Year 1 section of Little Wandle which includes a review of sounds from Phase 3 and 4, which have been previously taught in Reception, and then moves on to Phase 5. Once secure, children will move through the different phases.

HANDWRITING

In Year 1, we will be continuing to practice letter formation. In Autumn, we will be looking at the 'Ladder letter family (l, i, u, t, y and j), followed by some of the 'One-armed Robot family (n, m and h). A range of resources will be shared in the coming weeks via Google Classroom.
