At 15 Joanne was diagnosed with Ewings Sarcoma. She went through chemotherapy which was gruelling and other children in school were unforgiving. But here she is, 24 years later, at almost 40 (she said I was allowed to share that!) so grateful to have received the treatment which has allowed her to live her life. Let's see if we can offer our support...

2000 burpees per day..... Sounds horrendous, but she is doing it to raise awareness and much needed cash for the Bone Cancer Research Trust.

Every 10minutes somewhere another child, teenager or adult is diagnosed with this disease and they face a 5 year chance of survival at little over 50%. The Bone Cancer Trust is the only charity dedicated to this disease, it is a small but national charity based in Leeds. They fund ground breaking research into life saving initiatives and provide dedicated and trustworthy information and support to patients and their loved ones. All without any Government funding. They rely 100% on people like you supporting their work through generous donations.

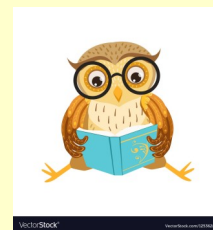

Covid update from Councillor Smith

26/11/20: New announcements from No.10 below...

What does it mean for Winwick and Warrington? As at 2nd December, Warrington has been placed in Tier 2 HIGH, this means...

- You must not socialise with anyone you do not live with or who is not in your support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place.
- Rule of six applies in outdoor public spaces like parks.
- Hospitality venues selling food for consumption are required to provide table service only and close between 11pm and 5am.
- Indoor entertainment venues such as cinemas, bowling alleys, theme parks, funfairs and adventure parks are to re-open.
- Places of worship to remain open

We may be under these new restrictions for the next few weeks but we do have Christmas to look forward to where we hope we will be able to join with our nearest and dearest. The above guidance will be reviewed again on the 16th December. Please ensure you keep to the guidance above so we can see our loved ones this Christmas. For some of us it has been a very long time.

We have a number of parents who are forgetting or not wearing masks on the approach to and in the school grounds at pick up and drop off. This is a requirement now from the Government and not just a recommendation from school. Please play your part to keep everyone safe.
