Well it has certainly been an eventful week at Winwick this week!

The children have been working on their end of term assessments and teachers have been so proud of how much they have shown our value of Perseverance—well done children. Parents/carers will get a progress update as part of your child's end of year report which will be sent out in July, along with a summary of their progress across the academic year. The results will also be shared with the children's next class teacher to enable them to identify the targets the children need to work on as they move up in to their next class.

We have lots of transition activities going on at the moment; our Year 5 children spend the day at Hope Academy for their Ethos Day this week to get a flavour of what life is like at a high school; Miss Platt has been out to visit different nurseries to meet some of our new Reception children in their current settings; our Year 6 children are preparing for their transition days to their high schools next week and we have also shared our staffing overview for next academic year with you via PING this week in advance of our transition days in school next week. If have not already checked, please see the letter which was sent out earlier this week via PING.

Finally, a small group of our Upper Key Stage 2 children were invited by Warrington Borough Council's Road Safety Officer to take part Children's Court today as part of their speeding campaign. The children did an amazing job—well done: *"I would just like to say a huge thank you and well done to the children today. They showed incredible confidence in the Children's Court, and they made a lasting difference to the drivers who were stopped for speeding. The drivers seemed to listen carefully to what the children were saying, which shows that young people can spark change in the community. The speeding campaign was a remarkable success today, and it couldn't have happened without the participation of your school. The impact on the drivers was quite powerful. 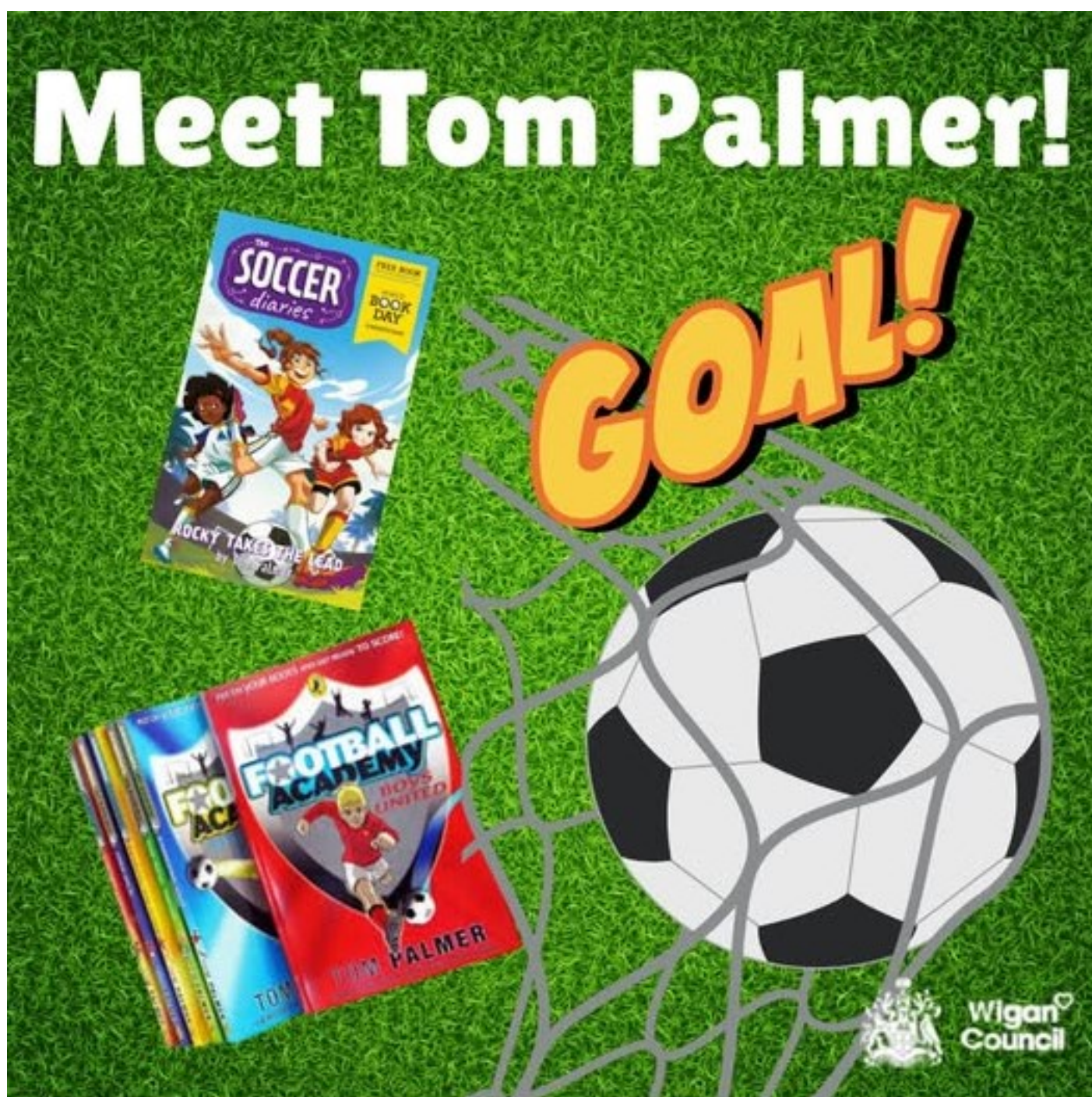
