<u>Warrington is a 'very high risk' area</u> - from Tuesday 27th October Please do everything you can to stick to these restrictions as it impacts on our whole school & the wider community.

- You must not socialise with anybody you do not live with, or have not formed a support bubble with, in any indoor setting, in any private garden, or at any outdoor hospitality venue or ticketed event;
- You must not socialise in a group of more than 6 in an outdoor public space such as a park or beach, the countryside, a public garden or a sports venue;
- People should try to avoid travelling outside the 'very high' alert level or entering a 'very high' alert level area, other than for work, education or for caring responsibilities, or to travel through as part of a longer journey;
- Residents should avoid staying overnight in another part of the UK, and others should avoid staying overnight in the 'very high' alert area;
- In addition, soft play centres and areas will also be closed.

In Warrington, infection rates are among the highest in the country and are continuing to rise rapidly, with case rates at 407 people per 100,000 among all age groups. Broken down this is 854 cases in the last week with an increase of 131. Hospital admissions and corona related deaths are also continuing to rise in Warrington and the surrounding areas. In order to reduce these numbers and ensure that the NHS isn't overwhelmed and has capacity to treat other conditions, we need to act now. Please let's work together as a community to support and protect each other. Our hope is that all classes can remain in school learning for as much of the term as we can. If you have any concerns over a child, or adult, displaying symptoms, or are awaiting the results of a test in the family home, please do not send your child into school. THANK YOU
