CHRISTMAS GUIDANCE: 23rd—27th December A Christmas bubble will be able to spend time together in private homes, including second homes and caravans, to attend places of worship, or meet in a public outdoor place. If you do form a Christmas bubble, you should not meet socially with friends and family you do not live with in your home or garden unless they are part of your Christmas bubble. In all other settings, people should follow local restrictions in the tier in which they are meeting. If you do not form a Christmas bubble, you should continue to follow the guidance for the tier you are in. From 28 December, you must follow the guidance for the tier in your area. Christmas bubbles will no longer apply.

#### 26/11/20-23rd December: Tier 2 HIGH

- You must not socialise with anyone you do not live with or who is not in your support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place.
- Rule of six applies in outdoor public spaces like parks.
- Hospitality venues selling food for consumption are required to provide table service only and close between 11pm and 5am.
- Indoor entertainment venues such as cinemas, bowling alleys, theme parks, funfairs and adventure parks are to re-open.
- Places of worship to remain open

Please stay safe over the Christmas period and remember to not return to school on the 5th January if anyone in the household has symptoms, has gone for a test and is awaiting results, or has been in contact with anyone with a positive result.
