Cardboard Tube Blossom Tree

Supplies

- Scissors
- Brown paint
- Shallow tray or plate
- Paintbrush
- Pink or white tissue paper/ crepe paper
- PVA glue
- Cardboard tube







First, you need to paint the tube brown. Pour a little brown paint onto a tray or plate, to limit any mess and use a brush to make sure that all of your branches are covered with paint. Remember to paint inside the top of the tube as well. Leave it to dry.



Next, carefully scrunch and roll some small pieces of tissue paper or crepe paper into little blossoms.



Make several cuts down the sides of one end of the tube. These will make the branches of your tree; how far you cut will depend on the length of your tube. Take your time and keep checking as you cut to ensure that you aren't cutting too far down.




Carefully dab a little glue along the ends of the branches and stick the blossom on. Then allow to dry.



Once you are happy with your cuts, gently press down and open out the pieces you have just cut. Now you have a tree shape!



Cardboard Tube Blossom Tree



Supplies
