Featuring a re-enactment by the Battle of Winwick Society of:

The Battle of Winwick 19th August 1648

The Battle of Winwick, fought with muskets and pikes, in the fields bordering Winwick was an event of national significance in the English Civil War. It was one of two major battles which saw the final defeat of King Charles Ist and his supporters. Historic St Oswald's Church became involved as both a battle ground, a refuge and a prison for hundreds of Scottish troops fleeing the conflict.



Members of the Battle of Winwick Society dressed in authentic costume, will give a dramatic and accurate re-enactment of the lifestyle and conditions endured by the defeated Scottish prisoners as well as an insight into those of the victorious Cromwellian troops and civilians involved in the war. The event will take place within the church grounds and within the church itself.

At 12 noon, Saturday 7th: Visitors are invited to an introductory talk in church by a member of the battle of Winwick Society. The talk will present fascinating facts about the battle and give an understanding to visitors about the national importance of a major battle fought hundreds of years ago on their door steps.
