We've had a great week in school this week, with a range of different learning activities taking place. We have been continuing to reflect on our core value of Love, reflecting on what things around our school might we see people doing to show God's love? In our Learning Gallery for this week, you will see a range of children's writing from across the school from Reception to Year 6. Over recent years, we have been working closely with a group of local CoFE schools to share best practice and work on key school improvement opportunities. On Wednesday, some of our teaching assistants joined others from the group of schools for some training from the Literacy Company linked to supporting children with their writing; Year 4 teachers from the group also met to do some training, as well as doing cross-school moderation of writing. As with last academic year, all year groups will meet together a number of times this year to complete writing moderation to support teacher assessment and consistency in writing judgements against age-related expectations. On Wednesday 11th October, as well as having our Career's Day in school, we will also be having our SIAMS Inspection (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools). Our inspector, Rob Dean, will be visiting us for the day and we look forward to sharing with him all of the things that make Winwick CE Primary School such a special place to be. Our Career's Day will still take place; children have been invited to come dressed for a career they aspire to. We will also be asking children to reflect on their aspirations for the future, as well as having some visiting speakers from different professions. Thank you to all those parents who offered to speak with the children. As we also have our SIAMS Inspection, we will be adding another Career's Day later this academic year to access more guest speakers, as well as hopefully being able to invite those who were already busy on Wednesday. Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October: All after school enrichment clubs end for the half term.

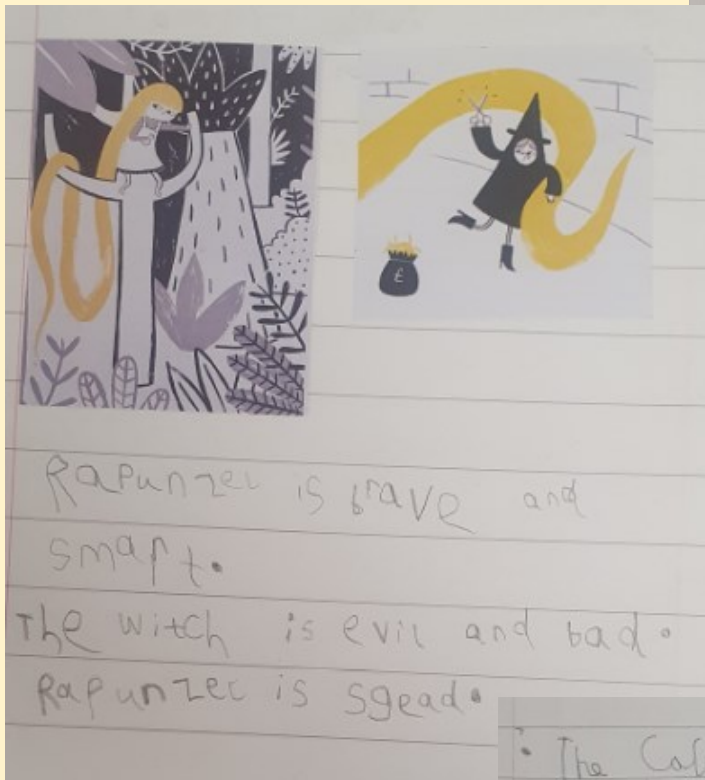

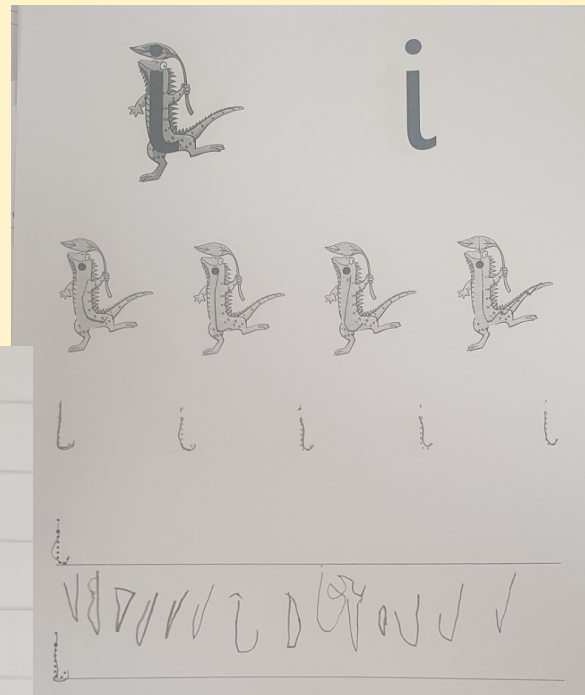


# Our learning this week...
