Winwick CE Primary School

Sports Premium Plan 2022/23



The Sports Premium is additional funding from the Government to provide substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. At present there is a commitment to provide funding through to 2023. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. All state-maintained schools, academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils will receive the funding.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can **only** be spent on provision for **PE** & **Sport**. Schools are accountable for how the additional funding is used to support pupil's progress and participation in PE and school sport. We are required to publish on-line information about how we have used the additional funding, including details about our sporting provision alongside curriculum details. This will ensure that parents/carers and others are made fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at Legh Vale.

Allocation:

For the financial year April 2022 – March 2023 we have an estimated amount of **£20,162**.

How we will be spending the Sports Premium funding:

We believe in a holistic approach to the development of sport and physical activity for all and encourage collaboration and partnership working to make the best use of resources and enhance PE and sport provision in order to raise participation and achievement for all pupils.

We have currently undertaken a PE and School Sport audit and developed our Sports Premium plan to raise standards and participation levels in PE throughout the school. Our rationale for the use of Sports Premium funding, which the Governors have agreed, are that it must be used so that:

- all children benefit regardless of sporting ability
- children are given the opportunity to compete in tournaments with other school's staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development
- some activities may be subsidised so that pupils do not miss out due to financial constraints e.g. swimming/outdoor pursuits
- we make use of collaborative and partnership working

With the above rationale in mind, and following the guidelines for how to spend this money, our initial plans for the use of the Sports Premium funding include:

- Investment in the professional development of staff at our school so they are best equipped to teach high quality Physical Education and school sport for years to come. This will include providing cover to release staff for professional development in PE and sport.
- Investment in scheme of work to support staff, ensure progression across year groups and that the key fundamentals are covered across all year groups.
- Employing a fully qualified specialist sports coach for afternoons to work with teachers.

- Making links to other community sports providers encouraging pupils to join out of school sports clubs via online activities
- Replace any equipment that is needed or purchase additional to maximise opportunities for pupils to participate especially taking into account quarantining equipment etc
- Increased time allocated for CPD for staff
- Developing the outdoor and adventurous activities element of the PE curriculum, utilising the school's own grounds and facilities.e.g. playground markings
- Employing a professional mindfulness teacher to work with staff and children as part
- Provide free opportunities for children to try new sports

Impact:

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal selfevaluation and provision mapping arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school.

Assessments are made both formally and informally using our school assessment systems as well as feedback from staff and visitors to the school. We will also evaluate the impact of professional development opportunities in improving teaching and learning in PE.

Impact – We now have staff far more confident in delivering quality PE lessons after working alongside a specialist sports coach

Impact – Excellent participation in after school sporting clubs with pupils accessing new sports

Impact – focussed/targeted approach on pupils that would not ordinarily choose an afterschool sporting activity.

Impact – Mindfulness are all supporting our focus on children's mental health & well-being with some very positive outcomes for targeted children.

Impact - Pupils will enjoy taking part in creative performance

Winwick CE School has PE, Sport & Well-Being as very high profile at the heart of our curriculum.

The school prides itself on the amount of physical activity, PE and sport that takes place and how successful we are in achieving all of our aims with maximum sustainable impact. A huge thank you must go to all the staff, who give freely of their time to encourage, coach, support and develop sport in our school.

Our commitment to sport at Winwick CE has been nationally recognised by receiving our seventh National Award. After achieving 3 **GOLD** standards we received a National School Games Award and continuing to work towards Platinum.
